Employees Honored—35 Years

- Craig Clough began his longtime career at Midwest on March 25, 1974 on the underground crew with only one other employee, the late Dwayne Wykert.

A year later Clough moved to Paxton where he became a lineman in training. In 1981 he was promoted to foreman there.

In May 1988, Clough moved back to Grant to fill a position as apparatus specialist following the retirement of Don Sides. He worked as apparatus specialist until 2001 when he was promoted to his current position of engineering manager. In 2005 he was promoted to assistant general manager.

- Bruce Geisert began employment at Midwest on May 12, 1974 as a member of the underground crew and construction crew.

In 1978 he worked as a serviceman on the underground crew and in 1981 he moved to the overhead construction crew as a lineman.

In 1986 Geisert was promoted to foreman of the maintenance crew for the City of Grant and Area I.

In 1993 he was promoted to assistant operations manager along with his duties as foreman for the city maintenance crew.

Geisert is Midwest's safety director and has worked very hard over the years on the RE Safety Accreditation Program for the coop. He has served as an instructor for 15 years for the Nebraska Rural Electric Association's Rubber Gloving School.

- Karl Dudo started with Midwest on Aug. 6, 1974 on the underground crew, working with Craig Clough and the late Dwayne Wykert.

Upon the retirement of Dwayne Wykert in November 1987, Dudo became the URD foreman and has been the foreman for the past 22 years.

Dudo has served as an instructor for 15 years for the Nebraska Rural Electric Association's

Underground School.
