

*Directors for three district seats will be elected during the 65th annual meeting of Midwest Electric Cooperative Corporation on Thursday, March 15 at Perkins County High School.*

On Jan. 10, nine members from the nominating committee of Midwest Electric Cooperative Corporation were present to select director nominees for Districts 2, 4 and 7.

The slate of nominees will be presented during Midwest Electric's 65th annual meeting set for Thursday, March 15.

The nominees and their respective districts include:

- District 2: Incumbent-Nathan Geisert of Ogallala and Mark Speck of Keystone.
- District 4: Dick Hasenauer-incumbent will be challenged by three nominees—Larry Coppersmith of Wallace, Vance McCoy and Brent Robertson, both of Elsie.
- District 7: Incumbent is Shawn Stutzman of Venango. Other nominees are Russ Gregg and Roxie Lampmann, both of Grant.

Directors elected at the March meeting will serve a term of three years.
