June 21, 2012

June 19, 2003

Twenty-five Years Ago

June 22, 1988

Kindergartners at Grant Elementary would attend school all day, every day, for the 1988-89 school year. It marked the first time in the school's history that kindergartners would attend all day, every day. Previously, they had attended school for two full days and every other Friday.

Fifty Years Ago

June 20, 1963

The Civic Improvement Association worked on getting donations and pledges for the Grant theatre fund. Sufficient funds had to be in possession before bids could be placed on any property, etc. Many clubs and organizations had generously donated but the backing of individuals was needed as well.

Seventy-Five Years Ago

June 23, 1938

Grant was host to a five-room cottage which was on its way to from Benkelman to Ogallala. The house was mounted on a large semi-trailer. The law required that houses and other large objects be moved only between the hours of midnight and 6 a.m., so it was necessary for the house to remain in Grant overnight.
