

Emergency CRP haying and grazing authorized

Nebraska Farm Service Agency (FSA) announced that Perkins County is authorized for emergency haying and grazing use of Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) acres for 2012.

The CRP emergency haying authorization for 2012 began July 16, 2012 and the emergency grazing authorization began on July 5, 2012. Haying must be completed by August 30, 2012 and grazing currently ends on Sept. 30, 2012.

Eligible producers who are interested in emergency haying and/or grazing of CRP must request written approval from the Farm Service Agency before haying or grazing eligible acreage. Producers must also obtain a modified conservation plan from the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) that outlines permitted haying and grazing practices. There will be a 10 percent annual payment reduction for CRP acres used for haying or grazing under these emergency provisions.

To take advantage of the emergency haying and/or grazing provisions, authorized producers can use the CRP acreage for their own livestock or may grant another livestock producer use of the CRP acreage. However, hay production may NOT BE SOLD under emergency provisions. Additional restrictions also apply.
