

The annual Caring for Children Conference will be held on Saturday, March 27.

The conference, which is sponsored by the High Plains Early Childhood Professional Development Partnership, is set for McCook Community College from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Central Time.

The keynote speaker will be Michelle Rupiper, director of the Ruth Staples Child Development Laboratory at UNL.
