

The Sandhills Crisis Intervention Program (SCIP) is hosting the fourth annual Walk-A-Mile in Their Shoes, which combines big hearts with brave feet and brings the community together for a great cause.

The event premise is simple—men and women are nominated to walk in the Ogallala Rendezvous parade, with the men wearing women's shoes and the women wearing men's shoes, along with any other attire of their choice.

The community shows support for the nominated walkers and the cause by pledging money to see the individuals march against domestic violence.

For 25 years, SCIP has been providing direct services to families that have been victimized by domestic violence. Funds raised by the Walk-A-Mile will support programs that forever affect the lives of families in the community.
