- A family or group may hold a private pool party for a charge of \$30 plus fees for a lifeguard.
- Beginning on Monday, June 10, water aerobics will be held Monday-Wednesday-Friday from 5:30-6:30 p.m. Those possessing a season pass will gain free entry. Others will be charged \$20 plus daily fee.
