Scholarship recipients must be a high school senior or college student, have a "C" or higher grade point average, and be enrolled or intend to enroll full-time in any college or university that

offers a bachelor degree, an approved vocation or trade school, or a state accredited junior college.

Preference will be given to students attending a Nebraska institute of higher learning and preference will be given to students majoring in an agricultural field of study.

Scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic achievement, beef industry involvement and goals and quality of application.
